



It's March 4th and I already have goose bumps just thinking about the up-coming Gem Show!

Yes, it's a year of hard work and planning and yes, there are always loose ends, but this is THE MOST FUN YOU CAN HAVE. EVER!

With so many new members joining us I thought it might be fun to share some of the things that go on Behind the Scenes that help make our show so Outstanding...

(The secret is: Outstanding volunteers!)

● Let's begin with our faithful <u>VOLUNTEER UNIT</u> of the Calaveras Co. Sheriff's Department - they provide our security from Friday morning until Sunday evening when our last vendor/dealer drives off into the sunset.

These are dedicated men and women that have completed their careers in law enforcement and now continue to help their communities by volunteering during their retirement years. Their quiet presence does not go un-noticed and is greatly appreciated by our vendors and guests. In return, we contribute to their non-profit organization and keep them well fed!



- Each year the big HALL needs to be re-set and that requires the competent <u>FROGTOWN</u> <u>CREW.</u> Over 450 feet of pipe & green drapes need to be assembled...a giant scissor-lift is used to bring the four electric lines down from the 40-foot ceiling to supply power for our venues...750-pound ginormous wooden picnic tables need to be fork-lifted into position for our guest eating areas...the 2.5x6 foot glass display case need to be delivered...and, everything needs to be clean and in working order. Thank you, Larry & Donnie!
- For a zillion years, we shared our ponderous 8-foot wooden tables with the Fair Grounds to use for all the community events...well, over the years, those slowly disintegrated and HURRAH! local organizations have donated new light-weight 8-foot tables for all to use and protect.
- ...Now then, how many tables do you think we need to fill a HALL 80-ft x 160-ft??? AND, who is going to set up all those tables and chairs??... cont...

continued...Tables and chairs:

• Those of us who have lived in the area for more than a few years will not be surprised to learn that inmates from the local Honor Farm are utilized to set up the HALL.

These young men are trained as wildland firefighters and during their non-fire work hours they perform community tasks...in their fire uniforms...ready at a moment's notice to race off on a fire call. If not for them, we club members would be setting up over 110 tables and 200 chairs for the show.

● So, let's talk about that "skirting" process... For the past zillion shows, members have used rolls of green vinyl - 100s of yards - to cover the tables used in the show. We are talking hours of back-breaking work!

This year, due to the availability and excellent price point, we were able to purchase 8-ft fitted black fabric table covers for all our tables. And, not a moment too soon...we hardly have any able-bodied members left to do the old back-breaking task!

We have also purchased fabric to make custom covers for our 13 tall wooden tables and a skirt for the free-standing display case.

● FUN SIDE NOTE: If I have figured the cuts correctly and the fabric is the width and length advertised, I should have enough in remnants to make about 20+VESTS for members to purchase! I won't begin sewing until after the 2019 show so we'll have time to talk about it. Finished vests in the past were \$25 plus \$7.50 for the big 6-inch back patch. (Members did the sewing for free and the \$\$ went into the club bank account.) Any volunteers??

We apply for a permit each year from Cal Trans to hang the banner BUT all the credit goes to Jim Heryford, owner of Gold Electric in Murphys who uses his men and trucks to hang the banner (and remove it!) for FREE. he shares his time and his abundant talents with everyone.







New Business

RE: Laptop for the Treasurer...

to standardized accounting procedure. Andrew Brown will check into prices for a Laptop. Suggested purchase price of \$300.00 - \$500.00. Lynn made a motion that the club purchases a laptop computer for treasure's use. Robin seconded the motion. Motion passed by the Board.

Meeting was adjourned at 11:20 a.m. by President Anna Christiansen


